It's one of Australia's largest frogs. The female frogs are bigger than the males.

Where are they found?

They can be found in coastal swamps and marshes in south-eastern Australia.

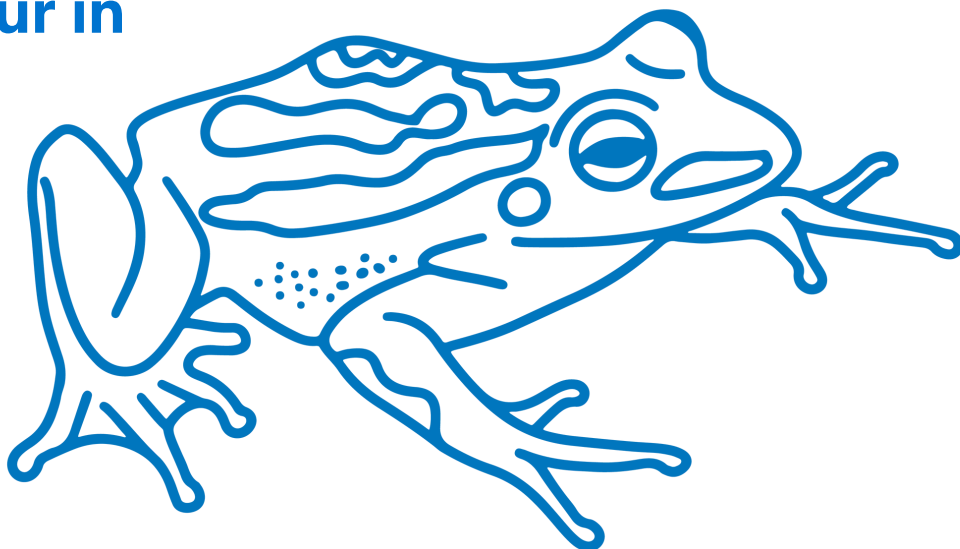
