Scientific name:

Prostanthera galbraithiae.

Status:

Vulnerable.

Fun fact:

The Wellington mint-bush needs fire to help it grow. But if fires happen too often they can't release their seeds.

A fire every 15 years gives them the best chance to grow.

Where are they found?

It's only found in two places - the Holey Plains State Park near Sale and the Dutson Downs property we manage.

**How are we helping?**

We've fenced off the areas it grows to protect them from pests and manage the weeds.

We've planted over 200 seedlings to give their numbers a helping hand.

We're working with experts on surveys, planned burns and research projects to learn more about them.

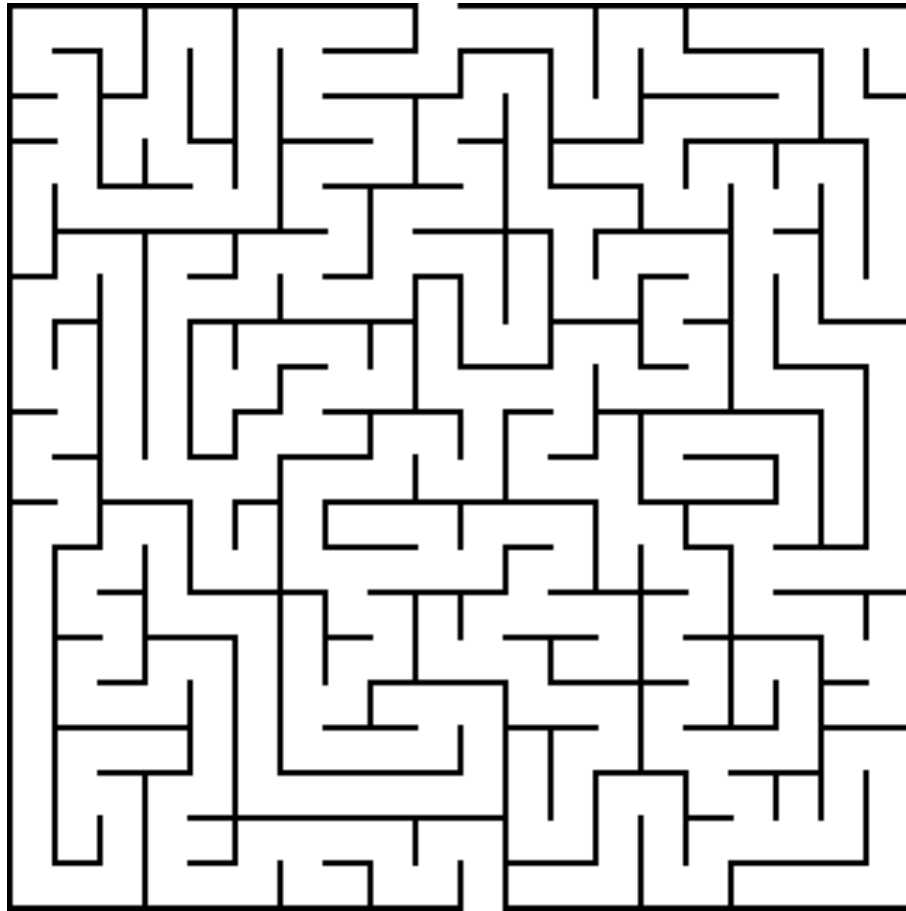

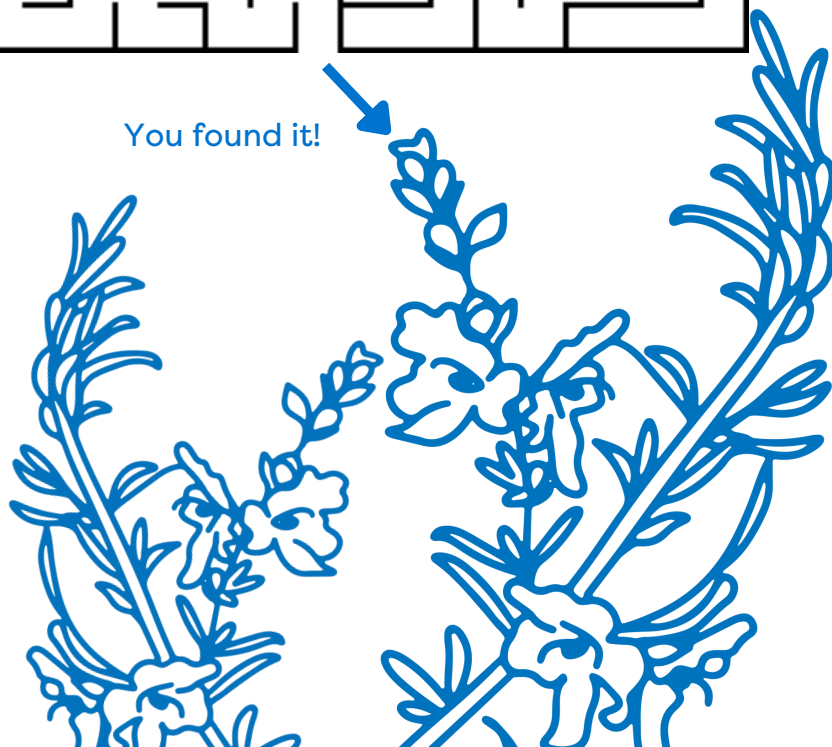
